

HOMEWORK TASK	<p>As part of our 'A Crime Through Time' topic, we would like you to explore the historical world of crime.</p>
VISUAL I enjoy painting, drawing and visualising. 	<p>Create a 2D image of a criminal scene (this could be a drawing, collage, painting). You could use your learning about smugglers or The Highwayman. What will it look like? What sort of colours will you use? What things will be there?</p>
KINAESTHETIC I enjoy doing hands-on activities. 	<p>Create a criminal world inside a shoebox. You can use a range of materials such as pipe cleaners, cotton wool, feathers, pom -poms to make your world as creative as you like!</p>
VERBAL I enjoy reading, writing and speaking. 	<p>Write a poem about a criminal or criminal scene. Who is this person? What did they do? What will happen to them in the end? Be prepared to learn it off by heart and share it with your class.</p>
INTERPERSONAL I enjoy working with others. 	<p>Imagine you are a criminal mastermind. Create a plan for your criminal comrades (team) to carry out a crime. Where will they go? What will they do? What will they need to bring? Create a detailed plan. This can include photos, pictures, a list of roles and resources and a list of things to do. Share with someone at home and then bring in to share with the class.</p>
INTRAPERSONAL I enjoy working by myself. 	<p>Research a famous crime that was committed. Who was involved? What happened? Were they caught and if so, how? What was there punishment? Present your findings in a method of your choice - example: poster, leaflet, newspaper article.</p>
